We are happy to announce that <u>Doodle</u> for Google is returning for its 17th year this October! If you aren't familiar, Doodle for Google is an annual contest where we invite students in grades K-12 to express their creativity by drawing their very own Google Doodle in response to a theme. Prizes will be awarded to our Doodle Finalists and include scholarship money, a feature on Google's homepage, and more!

We're excited to share the theme for Doodle for Google 2025-26:

My superpower is...

This year's contest invites students to look inward and consider what unique strengths, qualities, or characteristics make them powerful—and we don't mean fantastical things like flying or super strength! We are inviting students to envision the authentic traits that make them special. A "superpower" could be something small, like the ability to make people laugh or being a good listener. We're excited to see the many ways that students uniquely contribute to their schools, families, or wider local communities.

As an educator, you play an important role in encouraging creativity among your students. Submit online (recommended):

Combine the Doodle image and completed entry form into one .jpg or .png file. Then, visit doodles.google.com/d4g/enter/ and click or tap "Submit online."

Submit by mail:

If the Doodle was not created directly on the form, it must be attached to it (use glue or clear tape to do so). Carefully package your entry in an envelope so that it won't get damaged, affix the proper postage, and mail it to:
